




"BHAGS" Rule at Spring 2002 Annual Strategy Retreat

On April 8, 2002 Start Up's Board of Directors gathered for an intensive, six-hour annual strategy retreat session, once again graciously hosted by Cooley Godward, LLP in Palo Alto. The longer than usual session was intentional – board members were charged with reviewing the results of an intensive strategic planning process spearheaded by Director Steve Zuckerman and staffed by an impressive team of Bain and Co. volunteers led by William Foster which was convened by Director Steve Ellis. Based on the review, the board was also to chart the organization's development over the next five years. During the lively discussion that ensued among the 20+ individuals in attendance, an impressive set of "big, hairy, audacious goals (BHAGS)" were adopted pertaining to program operations, fundraising, and replication. Specifically, board members committed to growing the organization so as to: (1) achieve a 50-50 balance between services provided to new entrepreneurs and local small business owners; (2) improve fundraising success by enhancing infrastructure and stabilizing annual processes; and (3) conduct a board-driven feasibility study to determine when and where the Start Up model can be replicated. Although further refinement of these goals is still in process, they are significant and exciting, and promise to provide even greater support of entrepreneurship in and around East Palo

Taking Care of Business

Development Journal -- Laying the Foundation

For a lean organization like Start Up, every donation counts. We operate on an annual budget of a little over \$450,000 – and 75% of the funds we receive are applied directly to training and technical assistance for our clients. Over the last year, while the economy took a downturn and the country dealt with the aftermath of September 11th, it became increasingly difficult for many nonprofits, including Start Up, to raise and who were working very hard to transform their ideas into the funds necessary to support organizational requirements.

So we analyzed the situation and made a strategic shift in our priorities. The first initiative was to seek out broader, deeper alliances with corporate and governmental entities. This has been very successful. The Small Business Development Intiative funded by Hewlett-Packard Company has enabled us to provide computer equipment and training to 34 small businesses - with more on the way over the next few months. We hope to expand these types of partnerships to ensure that Start Up entrepreneurs get the assistance so critically needed right

The second strategic move was an increased emphasis on operational efficiency, by reassessing our development infrastructure. We realized that we not only need to continue to raise funds to support our initiatives, we also need to be more efficient in our fundraising efforts to ensure that each dollar counts even more. So a new staff position was created at Start Up to implement new development infrastructure and processes. In May 2002, I joined Start Up as Development Lead. This summer, I am redeveloping our database architecture, fundraising pro- I hope to contribute to Start Up's trend of continuous improvecesses, campaign materials and technology capabilities (including enhanced email communications and web site features such as online credit card and electronic check donations). By improving our efficiencies and expanding our communication capabilities, we hope to become more cost-effective in our development efforts.

Of course, donations still matter. However, by taking a proactive approach towards greater efficiency, we can make sure that the investments go farther – with every donation. Ultimately this will translate into improved training programs, enhanced support services and greater capital access for even more aspiring Start Up entrepreneurs.

Spring 2002 Graduation Ceremony: "Reaching for Success!"

Start Up is proud to present the largest number of graduates ever from its entrepreneurship training classes (taught in English and Spanish). The commencement ceremony, where 47 training class participants graduated, was held Wednesday, May 8, 2002, at Community Church of East Palo Alto and was bilingual to accommodate a culturally diverse, English and Spanish-speaking group.

In keeping with the theme, "Reaching for Success/ Alcanzando al Éxito," the event featured greetings; a presentation by Start Up alumnus Dominic Bannister, co-owner of Delta Plumbing; a keynote speech by Supervisor Rose Jacobs Gibson, 4th District Vice-President of the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors; a community business partner welcome by Ricardo Ortiz, Vice President and Manager of California Bank & Trust's East Palo Alto Branch, and special presentations from Francis Anaya and Linda Walker of the Spring 2002 graduating class.

Harry James Strauss Entrepreneur Awards were presented to Alfredo Cortes and Anthony R. Strong for demonstrating exemplary entrepreneur spirit! Congressional Certificates were awarded to each graduate courtesy of the Office of U.S. Representative Anna G. Eshoo, 14th Congressional District, California.

The entrepreneurs who have completed Start Up's training program – 337 from previous years and 47 from the Spring 2002 classes – qualify for continued technical assistance, including pro bono legal relationships. They may also apply for various types of microloan referrals and recommendations and/or be selected to receive subsidized resources.

By providing this type of support, this exceptional organization has helped to create or expand over 105 currently operating local businesses. These enterprises include: tax preparation services, nonprofit organizations, insurance services, clothing lines, concrete cleaning services, elder and child care services, massage services, a daycare center, restaurants, real state consulting, technology import/export, and housecleaning services. Businesses planned, launched or expanded by Spring 2002 graduates are sure to enhance the quality and variety of goods and services now available from existing Start Up-supported enterprises.
