

Jalisco borders the Pacific Ocean and is a state in southwestern Mexico. It is the third most populous Mexican state. Jalisco is the place of origin of mariachi music, the beverage "tequila" (named for a local town) and the "charro" costume (tight fitting pants, a short jacket and a wide hat). Much of its manufacturing is concentrated in the capital and largest city, Guadalajara. Many of the dances of Jalisco are courtship, in which the man chases the woman until he catches her and all ends with a kiss behind his sombrero.

· YUCATAN

At the northern end of the Yucatan Peninsula of the Mexican Republic is the State of Yucatan, whose coastline is on the Gulf of Mexico. Except for a range of hills along the southwestern border, Yucatan consists of a sparsely inhabited plain formed of a chalky crustacean deposit. Rainfall is limited and occurs from May to Sept. Most of the population is Maya, and 40% of the population lives in Merida, the capital city. The chief source of wealth is henequen from which sisal hemp is obtained.

NUEVO LEON

In the northwest of the Mexican Republic is the State of Nuevo Leon. The state capital, Monterrey, is the third largest city in Mexico. Neighboring with the United States' southern borders, a lot of "cowboy" influences are seen in the dances and costumes of this northern area. Over 75% of Mexico's iron and steel are turned out here along with many other products which contribute to the industrial smog. The style of dance termed "Norteño" was thought to have originated from the German and Czech settlers who lived along the Mexican-American border in the late 19th century. They brought with them polka music, played on the accordion, bass, bajo sexto (12-string guitar) and a wooden block called a redova.

EVANGELINA

NAYARIT

A State of the Mexican Republic which lies along the Pacific Coast in west-central Mexico. The Sierra of Nayarit, part of the Sierra Madre Occidental, crosses the state from north-west to southeast, making the eastern portion a mountainous region of forrested lopes and valleys. The western sections along the coast are tropical agricultural regions, producing cotton, sugar, coffee, palm oil and decorative woods. The Capital is Tepic. This is the home of the Huichol and Cora Indians. Its neighbor to the South is Jalisco, therefore many similaries in the costumes and dance steps.
