which he administered a million dollar budget and supervised a staff of eight people.

Doctor James is currently working as a private consultant to the Ravenswood Park and Recreation District in East Palo Alto, preparing an organizational plan and a budget for the

district.

Also high on the doctor's list of priorities is the establishment of a non-profit corporation to work in conjunction with the district to prepare applications for state, federal and private grants for a variety of renovation projects, includ-

ing the Bell Street Gymnasium and Swimming Pool.
