DISSOLUTION OF EAST PALO ALTO SANITARY DISTRICT
AS PART OF THE REORGANIZATION OF THE EAST PALO ALTO AREA

All of the voters on this ballot are making two choices with one vote. we must be approve a new City of East Palo Alto. Second, to transfer the Sanitary District to the new city.

Even though every voter will not live in the new city, each vote will affect the outcome of the incorporation election (Proposition A). Proposition C must pass to establish a new City of Fast Palo Alto.

The key issue before the voters is to approve a new city, or just keep things the same.

East Palo Alto can have one city government or be run by many different agencies. We can coordinate community planning or have the same problems because there is no coordination. We can have better services for ALL of the voters by passing Proposition C.

When East Palo Alto becomes a city, the community will control land-use, planning, and all city services. The new City Council will be responsible for all aspects of community development. It will replace the Municipal Council. The Sanitary District will also go out of business. Its functions will be transferred to the Public Works Department of the City of East Palo Alto. The new city may appoint a citizens' commission to advise the City Council in the area of sanitation policy and services.

Independent studies by SRI International and county consultants have shown that East Palo Alto has enough money to operate a successful city. The Public Works Department and all other city departments will operate on a sound financial basis.



Remember, these are monies that East Palo Alto NOW pays and which are spent by the county and other districts. Property taxes, by law, will not be increased by the new city.
