Attached is a <u>draft agenda</u> for our Small Business Conference. Also see first flyer ANNOUNCING the conference distributed on Saturday and Sunday Juneteenth weekend, by too few EDTF/TAC members. There is also a copy of the Business Survey form, indicating trends in responses representing 40% of the estimated 150 businesses in East Palo Alto.

The draft agenda represents the thinking of at least two (2) EDTF/TAC meetings. Please note the content and provide me with your advice on revisions, deletions or additions.
