
## A "Summer of Hope" for East Palo Alto

he children of East Palo Alto are getting some extra attention this summer, thanks to a collaborative new effort

we call the "Summer of Hope." The Cities of Palo Alto, East Palo Alto and Menlo Park, the Ravenswood City School District, nonprofit organizations, the Peninsula Community Foundation and other Bay Area funders have joined together to support educational and recreational programs for over 1000 children and youth in East Palo Alto.

The Peninsula Community Foundation is proud to have spearheaded this effort, and is now serving as the fiscal and grantmaking administrator for the project.

Officially known as the Rainbow Summer Program of 1993, this effort is vital to East Palo Alto. This year, after losing so many of its children to drugs and violence and being named the murder capital of the nation, the city is bouncing back. The community is responding to this drive for renewal with financial and moral support. Thanks to the generosity of local funders and the Peninsula Community Foundation's donor advisors, we have already met our original goal of raising \$195,000.

The "Summer of Hope" is already making a difference. One father noted that he wouldn't let his children out of the yard last year because of the threat of violence. This year, they are out in Bell Street Park's recreation program every day. Here is a sampling of other programs that are serving East Palo Alto's children:

• The Rainbow Summer Camp offers an alternative to the streets through a drop-in playground and recreation center, and overnight camping trips.

Sports Camps offer children the opportunity to learn and play volleyball, baseball, basketball, tennis and soccer.

The Children's Preservation Network is giving 55 children the chance to take up to 20 field trips to different communities in the Bay Area through the Great Excursions Summer Program.

 Over 100 young adults will be out on the courts with the Midnight Basketball League.

The Summer Jobs Wage Enhancement Program provides youth working throughout East Palo Alto an opportunity to work at an above-minimum wage job.

In addition to these programs, a host of other nonprofit organizations will expand their current summer programs to serve hundreds of additional children.

Yet the "Summer of Hope" won't affect just children. The City of East Palo Alto will be taking advantage of increased police protection and the support of neighboring cities to clean up and take back community parks, schools and neighborhoods from drug dealers and violence peddlers, and return them to families and the community.

"Summer of Hope" represents an exciting new venture for the Foundation. Over the last year, we have been one of the organizations that has brought together nonprofit organizations and local foundations and corporations to explore strategies that would benefit the

Together, this group, working with city officials, resolved to provide valuable activities to the thousands of children in East Palo Alto this summer.
