

## East Palo Alto official to tell them about young voters

EAST PALO ALTO — The 28-year-old chairman of the Municipal Council is going to Washington, D.C., today to tell 200 mayors a thing or two about young voters.

As one of the nation's youngest mayors (or chairmen), who was elected in a district where 40% of

the voters are under 30, Brad Stamper considers himself qualified to talk about the importance and influence of the youth vote.

Stamper will be one of six panelists to talk about the youth vote at a three-day meeting of the National

Conference of Black Mayors in Washington D.C.

His most important mission, however, is to convince the Conference of Black Mayors to endorse East Palo Alto's campaign to incorporate.
