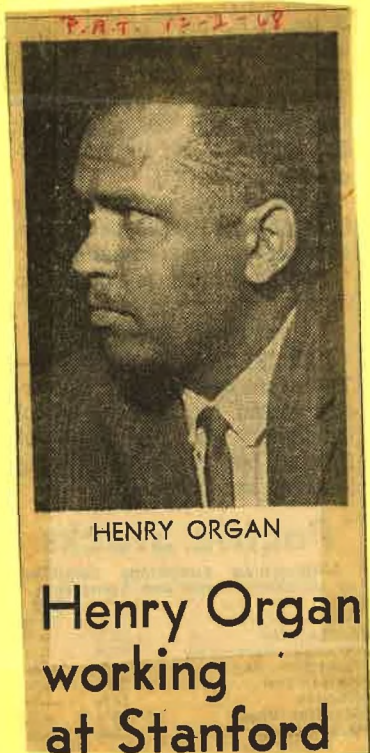


EPA - BIOGRAPHY

Henry P. Organ of East Palo Alto, first black trustee of the Sequoia Union High School District and longtime Midpeninsula civil rights worker, has joined the Stanford University administrative staff as a trainee.

During November he worked as a staff associate in the office of the general secretary, where he expects to remain for about a year. He will then work in another of the university's administrative offices under the cross-training program.

Before joining the university, Organ was an educational psychologist at Lockheed Missiles and Space Co. in Sunnyvale for the past nine years.

In October he was appointed to the Sequoia board.

Organ, 37, lives at 1900 Clarke St., in an apartment. He has been active in many East Palo Alto organizations, including the Day School and other teen-age project. He has worked for better jobs for members of his race through organizations such as CORE and as an individual.

He was born in Denison, Tex., and was graduated from Bishop College in Dallas, Tex., in 1951. He received his master's degree in educational psychology from the University of Illinois in 1958 and was an instructor and supervisor for technical schools at Sheppard and Chanute Air Force bases from 1951 to 1959.
