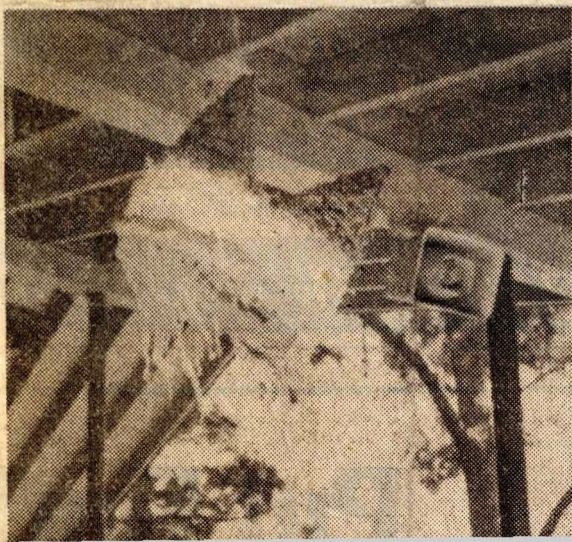


Seniors enjoy picnic
