SUBJECT: MAY 1971 ACHIEVEMENT TESTING

Enclosed you will find Graphs, Tables, and Charts all relating to the Achievement Tests that were administered during the first two weeks of May. When deemed appropriate, comparisons were made with the results of previous years. Since the majority of the data is self-explanatory, no written explanation is included. However, the author looks forward to a meaningful dialogue with the Board regarding the enclosed material, and will be more than happy to explain any nebulous areas.

Overall, the Board should be extremely pleased with the results. In particular, Kindergarten, First, and Second Grade students have shown continued growth, surpassing both publishers and State norms. While these results display some variation from schoolto-school and level-to-level, a general upward trend is clearly evident.

The most disappointing results are at the third grade level. At this level we have only been able to increase our achievement scores by one month since the May 1968 testing. These results are particularly disheartening since we anticipated gains due to the utilization of the Lippincott Reading Series for the first time this year at this level. A further analysis of the data, as well as a close look at our total Third grade program is clearly called for. These results are too overwhelming to be simply chalked off as "poor teaching."

Student growth is evidenced when the fourth grade results are analyzed. However, students generally are not able to return to their previous relative level of functioning and/or rate of progress. The lack of fourth grade data for previous years severely hinders the present analysis. Board Members Achievement Tests

In summary, the test results show great hope and accomplishment, while at the same time suggesting areas to focus our future attention. If the primary purpose of achievement testing is to provide data to view our efforts and to generate dialogue and hypotheses about future directions, this testing has done its job exceedingly well.



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

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


GRADE TWO READING SCORES 1968-71

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
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
