1.) PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Describe in detail

Raices de Mexico proposes to produce a family show, "Primavera en Mexico" (Spring in Mexico), a concert of Mexican folklore dance and music. This concert will be presented by the performing ensembles of the Company - children, teens and adults. Dances from at least seven of the thirty-one States of the Mexican Republic will be featured; approximately 18-21 dances in traditional costumes. The concert program will present background information on each of the different regions (sample attached), costumes or particular dance as a means of educating the community about an aspect of the Mexican culture.

There will be only one show presented on Saturday, May 17, 1997 at Sequoia High School's theater Carrginton Hall starting at 7:00 pm. The whole show will run approximately one hour and 45 minutes (including intermission). A \$5.00 per person admission will be charged, We want families to be able to afford attending this concert.

Raices de Mexico's Spring Concert will be presented by the children, teen & adult performing ensembles of the Company. Raices de Mexico's mission statement is to preserve & promote Mexican culture through a distinct art form - dance. Through this concert, Raices de Mexico will continue to educate the Redwood City community, as well as surrounding communities, about the rich music, costumes and dances that Mexico has to offer. Raices de Mexico is administered by a General Director and a Board of Directors. The only paid staff is the instructor. Dance classes are offered to children, teens and adults. There are approximately 32 people involved in the organization. Please see attachment A for major activities.
