AREAS IN WHICH YOUTH AND SENIOR CITIZENS ARE MOST VULNERABLE.

THE CLINIC IS HOUSED IN A GRAY-GREEN, TWO STORY HOUSE NEXT DOOR TO ST. FRANCIS CHURCH, 1395 BAY ROAD. ITS HOURS ARE 9 TO 5, MON-DAY THROUGH FRIDAY. PERSONS UN-ABLE TO PAY WILL NOT BE CHARGED; OTHERS WITH SLIGHTY MORE INCOME WILL BE CHARGED FEES ON A SLIDING SCALE, PHONE 853-1600 FOR INFOR-MATION. AN OPEN HOUSE WILL BE HELD APRIL 13, 4 TO 7 P.M.
