JUNETEENTH

THE HISTORY

JUNETEENTH IS AN ANNUAL CELEBRATION OF AFRIKAN HISTORY AND CULTURE TO OBSERVE THE ABOLITION OF SLAVERY IN AMERICA.

FROM THE 17TH CENTURY, AFRIKAN PEOPLE HAD BEEN BONDED IN SLAVERY -- A MOST DEPRIVING AND DEHUMANIZING CONDITION IN THE HISTORY OF HUMAN-KIND. ON SEPTEMBER 22, 1862, PRESIDENT ABRAHAM LINCOLN SIGNED THE EMANICIPATION PROCLAMATION AS A LEGAL DOCUMENT DECLARING SLAVERY TO BE ILLEGAL IN THE UNITED STATES. THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE EMANICIPATION PROCLAMATION BECAME EFFECTIVE ON JANUARY 1, 1863 -- WITH A COMPLETION DEADLINE OF TWO YEARS, ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 1865.

EVEN WITH SUCH A MANDATE, NINE STATES REFUSED TO OBEY AND ADHERE TO THIS EXECUTIVE ORDER AND DID NOT INFORM THE AFRIKAN SLAVES OF THEIR FREEDOM. UPON THIS FACT, PRESIDENT LINCOLN SENT FEDERAL TROOPS TO TEXAS, ARKANSAS, LOUISIANA, MISSISSIPPI, ALABAMA, GEORGIA, SOUTH CAROLINA, NORTH CAROLINA, AND FLORIDA -- TO ENFORCE THE EMANICIPATION PROCLAMATION. BETWEEN JUNE 13 AND JUNE 19, 1865, SIX MONTHS AFTER THE JANUARY 1, 1865 DEADLINE FOR FREEDOM FOR THE AFRIKAN SLAVES, THE AFRIKAN PEOPLE OF TEXAS, ARKANSAS, AND LOUISIANA RECEIVED THE NEWS OF THEIR FREEDOM.

DUE TO THE UNCERTAINTY OF THE EXACT DATE THAT AFRIKAN PEOPLE LEARNED ABOUT THEIR FREEDOM FROM SLAVERY, THE WORD "JUNETEENTH" WAS CREATED AND ACCEPTED AS THE LIBERATION DAY OF ALL AFRIKAN SLAVES IN AMERICA. WHILE SOME STATES DECLARE JUNETEENTH AS A LEGAL HOLIDAY, OTHERS OBSERVE THE CULTURAL EVENT IN THE FORM OF CELEBRATIONS TO HIGHLIGHT THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF AFRIKAN PEOPLE.

WHO IS NELSON MANDELA?

Nelson Mandela is one of the many freedom fighters that has been and continues to be a victim of the vicious apartheid system.

He was born July 18, 1918 in Azania (South Africa). He joined the African National Congress (ANC) in 1944 and helped to establish the youth wing of the ANC.

In 1952, Mandela took over the leadership of the nonviolent movement against the passbook laws that required all Black people in the cities of South Africa to carry identification stating their name, address, place of "employment" (which must be current), history of employment and more. Failure to present the passbook upon demand of the South African police means automatic imprisonment. Mandela was arrested for organizing these protests. He was later reprieved.

He was elected a regional president of the ANC. Nelson Mandela believed in non-violence. Eventually he stated that only after strikes and boycotts were unsuccessful, would he suggest that the struggle move to "selective sabotage of infrastructural installations." If the rights of Black people were still not guaranteed, then he would recommend direct sabotage of military installations. Finally, if nothing else worked, there should be generalized armed struggle.

In 1960, the ANC was banned in South Africa. Nelson Mandela became a wanted man. After two years of evading the police and continuing to work for the liberation of his people, Nelson Mandela was arrested.

He was tried and received **life plus five years!** for trying to improve the life conditions of his people, **our people.**

The Juneteenth organizing committee believes it is important when discussing freedom of our people to acknowledge the fact that **until all of us are free, none of us is free.**

FREE NELSON MANDELA !!

"The West refuses to understand what we mean by saying leave us alone. We are tired of being well-fed slaves. We want to fight for our freedom on empty bellies. Stop sustaining and maintaining apartheid. Stop financing apartheid. Again, the white man prescribes for us. He tells us we will suffer, as if we have not been suffering."
