The only legitimate purpose of a City is to provide for the Life and Growth of its people. In translating that purpose into some form of collective social action, the presumption is cooperation. The principle of cooperation presupposes that two or more persons can perform tasks better, more efficiently and effectively than one. This process implies choices, priorities, ranks, definitions, acceptances and rejections.

Therefore, the purposes of these seminars are to get an handle on those issues and problems that can be organized in ways to develop a municipal structure that will provide for the Life and Growth of the people of East Palo Alto, California.
