As you all know by now, after eighteen years of grassroots struggle, we have shut down the Romic facilities in East Palo Alto and the Gila River Indian community. This is a historic moment not only for our community, but for other communities who have been fighting companies like Romic everywhere, and for our environmental justice movement as a whole.

Many people said it couldn't be done. Many people questioned what impact young people would have on a large hazardous waste facility, let alone an industry. Many people said that after so many years, Romic was a fixture in our land that it was difficult to imagine our communities without it. As cliché as this may sound, what kept us grounded was believing in the power of the people, and how that power can transform institutions. As David Cruz, 21, a YUCA youth organizer said at our celebratory rally, "It was people of color, immigrants, youth, elders, people who live in garages, people who society thought was expendable – these were the people that shut Romic down."

So we ask you – as someone who also has been fighting for justice in your community -- to join us in celebrating the power of the people. Our gala, "Operation People Power: Mission Possible" will take place on Saturday, March 15, 2008, beginning at 5PM at Costaño Elementary School in East Palo Alto. Together, we will honor the generations of families who have grown up fighting for environmental justice in our community of East Palo Alto and the tribal nation of the Akimel O'Otham. You will hear powerful personal stories from young people and elders who have come together to fight for something bigger than all of us, and through that, they have changed the course of history.

In this invitation, you will find more information about our event, how to join us, and how to continue to support us now and in the future even if you can't make it.

We would be very blessed with your presence, as you have been a part of this struggle as well – whether it's through standing with us at the gates of Romic in protest, sharing your resources, making a phone call, or signing a petition. This is all our victory, so we hope you can join us.




