AGENCY: PROGRAM:

REDEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

Administers the preparation, review, adoption, and financing of the implementation of redevelopment plans for blighted areas in the City in accordance with the purpose, provisions and requirements of the State Redevelopment Law.

LONG-RANGE GOAL:

To eliminate and reverse blighted conditions throughout the City of East Palo Alto. To implement an effective low and moderate income housing program financed through tax increment revenues generated by redevelopment projects. To create employment opportunities for under-and unemployed residents. To enhance the City's revenue.

CURRENT YEAR OBJECTIVES:

- 1) Begin development in the established redevelopment project area for University and Bay Road.
- 2) Select & implement a redevelopment project area for the Industrial Park Zone.
- 3) Explore the establishment of a redevelopment project area for Cooley Landing.
- 4) Negotiate development agreements for implementing the University Circle Redevelopment project.
- 5) Coordinate efforts of the Agency with units within the Community Development Department to structure an effective affordable housing program.

PERFORMANCE MEASURES:

- Identify the specific project and developer.
- 2) Complete work by fall, 1990.
- 3) Complete work by winter, 1990.
- 4) Completed negotiations by fall, 1990.
- 5) Develop a plan to utilize tax increment revenues for low and moderate income housing by Spring, 1991.

NOTE:

Through the City\Agency Cooperation Agreement the Agency will strive to become self-sufficient through the supportive cooperation of City staff and resources.
